Environment Matters

As previously reported, Kathy is taking a step back from being our Environmental Advocate. So far, no-one has come forward to take over the role, but please speak to Eleanor if you would be interested.

Rather than letting the good advice in Kathy's 'Eco Living Ideas' lapse, we shall 're-cycle' some of the tips she has given us in previous years. This one, was first published in October 2020.

Kathy found the following list of ideas for saving energy in the kitchen on the Energy Saving website.

• Boil water in a kettle, then transfer to a pan, rather than boil water on the hob. Avoid boiling more than you need.

- Cover pots and pans with lids to keep the heat in the pan.
- Microwaves heat food far more efficiently than electric and gas hobs.

• Turn off the heat a couple of minutes before your meal is fully cooked. Electric hobs take time to cool down and your food will continue to cook in the pan.

• Keep the oven door closed and look through the glass door to check if your food is ready. Energy and heat escape every time you open the oven door.

• Prepare food in larger batches to save energy.

Reflection by Philip Baker

The House Group I attend has been working through the Gospel of Mark and, at our last session, we reached the section including the story of the blind beggar. Bartimaeus. You may recall that Jesus asked Bartimaeus "What do you want me to do for you" (Mark 10:51). Bartimaeus replied "Rabbi, I want to see" and Jesus restored his sight with the words "Go, your faith has healed you." (Mark 10:52). We were then asked to consider privately what we, as individuals, would ask God to do for us. How many times have you stood back and asked yourself that question? I cannot recall a single time that I have. Oh, I have asked God for a lot of things over the years but always in the moment, I have never stood back and viewed myself in the third party, as it were. However, I knew with instant clarity what it would be, something I have never considered but realised I have always needed (no, I am not going to share it!). It was a very powerful moment – read the story in Mark and then, while your mind is "in the zone" ask yourself that question - and see what happens.

If the response proves elusive or even "nothing" then here is a thought to get you going. Every day in Compline as part of my daily prayer plan, I say the prayer of penitence that asks for God to forgive our sins and we confess "before the whole company of heaven and one another, that we have sinned in thought, word and deed and in what we have failed to do." We are usually aware of what we do that is wrong, but how often do we consider those things which we failed to do? Perhaps we could let our minds dwell on that thought for a while and ask God to help us to realise how we sin through carelessness. And this is why it is important: if we do not know the extent of our sin, we cannot acknowledge it and therefore confess it. We ask God (there you are, the link to the story of Bartimaeus) to forgive the sins which we have confessed. I leave you to fill in the blanks!

Tree in memory of Don Kyte

The family of the late Don Kyte, who was a founder member of the St Mary's Burwell Preservation Trust, wishes to commemorate his life by planting a tree in the churchyard. The Preservation Trust supports this request and will bear the costs.

The PCC is very happy to support this proposal and plans to plant a Sorbus aria (whitebeam) in the churchyard. It is a native tree, which is long-lasting and low maintenance once established and should thrive in our chalky soil and fairly dry climate. It has clusters of white flowers in spring, followed by red berries in early autumn.

The proposed position of the tree is on the south western side of the church, near the path that runs from Lanes to Mandeville. We are currently waiting for permission from the Diocese and hope to plant the tree this autumn, which is the most favourable time.

We at St Mary's Church would really appreciate some help with a number of gardening jobs, including maintaining the paths which run through the churchyard.
