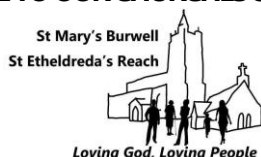

YOUR PRAYERS:

- Lord Jesus Christ, you speak to us of heavenly things, even when we are most interested in earthly things. Speak to us in the night-times of our lives, that we may learn the Way and the Will of your Holy Spirit.
- We pray for all people in places where there is ongoing unease, destruction and war across the globe, including Myanmar, Sudan, Syria and in particular for the people of Iran and the wider Middle East at this time of fear and uncertainty. Be near to those who are anxious; bring comfort to all who are suffering. Guide those with the power to make decisions and lead them in the ways of wisdom, compassion and moderation, that people of good will would seek harmony & reconciliation. We also pray for the continuing war in Ukraine. We pray for aid workers who are struggling to get food and medical supplies into war zones.
- For the work of organisations helping families around the world to overcome poverty and injustice, wherever the need is greatest, and there is high risk of famine including: Haiti, Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Yemen, Syria, DRC, South Sudan.
- For all those affected by the sudden catastrophic flash floods in Texas, for the many who have died, for their families and friends; for those still missing and for all those who have lost their homes.

- As extreme weather conditions affect the world with floods and wildfires, we pray for God's creation that we work harder to make the necessary changes to our lifestyle in order to safeguard and protect the integrity of all life. For governments and organisations to be prepared to take urgent action.

- We remember farmers and those who work in nature, especially those affected by the recent heatwaves; we ask God to make them good custodians of our natural environment. Make us all people who recognise, nurture and act towards a more sustainable world for the benefit of all who draw life from this planet.

- For all those struggling in today's difficult economic situation. May adequate immediate provision be made available, and support to find longer term solutions, so that everyone has their basic needs met for food, shelter, employment and security.

- For national and international governments as they tackle the economic and social issues which affect them. May those in authority act with wisdom and justice to bring greatest good for the greatest number of people.

- As students undertake exams, we pray for all those supporting them to achieve their best, parents, carers, teachers, and mentors. We give grateful thanks to those individuals who daily inspire our youth.

- For those ordained deacon or priest last weekend including those at Ely Cathedral and for those being ordained in the in the next few weeks.

- For our leaders as the Diocese continues the process of choosing a new Bishop of Ely. For this parish, for Eleanor, Paula, Jo, Virginia, Kevin & all in leadership.
