You could, therefore also support the campaign by being a welcomer in our church.

Blooming Flowers! What's Involved being a flower arranger

We at the St Mary's Flower Ministry are a friendly 'bunch' of flower lovers from Burwell and Reach who have the privilege of decorating both churches with our displays and we hope that our efforts have contributed to making these beautiful spaces welcoming places to worship – you may have noticed and enjoyed our arrangements from time to time and if you haven't, we hope you will take a look when you are next there.

We were formed over 15 years ago by Pauline Miller, who has generously shared her expertise with us beginners through her workshops, which covered all the basics of flower arranging – did you know that flowers and foliage need to be conditioned or that roses will last longer if dipped in boiling water for 30 seconds? (We didn't either.) Although Pauline has recently stepped back from her leading role, she is still involved and continues to offer advice when sought.

We meet in church about four to five times a year and over coffee and biscuits to plan for the various festivals in the Church calendar. Easter and Christmas are high on our agenda when we each decorate a window ledge and the porch. Other significant dates are Pentecost, Harvest Festival, Patronal and Remembrance Sunday. Often one of our more experienced members will volunteer to do a pedestal or the welcome table and we also put together posies for Mothering Sunday, ensuring that there are sufficient for the congregation of both churches. Other major events such as the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee and King Charles's Coronation were also in our remit, and occasionally we are asked to do the church flowers for weddings which is a major undertaking but also very enjoyable. Sometimes we use flowers from our own gardens which we arrange simply in vases or we purchase supermarket flowers which are often good value. For special events Wendy and Janet travel to a Flower Wholesalers where there is a greater selection.

Our funding is independent of the church and our main source of income is from the Easter Lily names displayed at the altar on Easter Sunday. The wedding flowers are also a good source of revenue. We use the income to purchase flowers and other materials we need. We remain solvent and in the past when we have had a healthy surplus we have been able to donate to charitable causes.

As a group, we always make sure we have an annual outing; this is usually a pub lunch although this year we are also considering a trip to a local garden centre.

We really would welcome new membership and you don't have to have experience; most of us have learned 'on the job,' and regular church attendance is not a requirement. If you would like to join our group please speak to Wendy.

Garden of Peace

Each year from September 1 to October 4, the Christian family unites for this worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. The 2025 Symbol is inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18. Titled "Garden of Peace," it depicts a white dove flying over a tree. The left side of the tree is barren, with roots digging into dry soil, surrounded by an arid, desolate landscape. In contrast, the right side of the tree is lush and green, standing amidst a flourishing landscape. The dove, carrying an olive branch in its beak, flies toward the right - symbolizing peace as a transition from a war-torn, overexploited land to one that is fertile, thriving, and hospitable. Let us remember that humanity was originally called to tend a garden.

Through this year's Season of Creation, there will be time for reflection on the connection between caring for creation and fostering peace, and prayer for our world.

Charity Update

Solar Aid (SolarAid | Combatting poverty and climate change) was one of the charities the PCC supported last year as part of its Mission Giving. It aims to provide simple solar powered lamps to communities in sub-Saharan Africa, which enable people to work and learn safely after dark. We recently received this update on their work:

We're so excited to share that we have made history! All of the 8,813 homes in the community of Kasakula, Malawi are connected to solar power - that is 100% of households. Not only that - 12 of the schools in the community now also have light, and the rural health centre will be able to treat patients after dark. We even have a repair centre in the community to ensure sustainability of the products.

Thanks to your incredible support, we have reached 100% of this community with clean, safe, and affordable solar power. You have helped hit this major milestone.

Environment Matters

The way our food is produced, transported and prepared can affect the environment, so here are some ideas of things you can do to reduce the negative impact.

Use your **LOAF** – buy **local**, **organic**, **animal-friendly** and **fairly traded** goods.

Freezing fruit and vegetables is easy and most taste just as good when used later. Take advantage of local offers to stock up and perhaps go blackberrying.

Look out for markets and Farm Shops that feature local producers. Some advertise on the internet and will even deliver.

It helps to reduce food waste if you plan meals and only buy the items and quantities that you need. It's also a good idea to think of ways to use left overs.

Buying unwrapped fruit and vegetables not only avoids collecting plastic wrapping, but means you can buy smaller amounts. If you grow your own fruit and veg and have some to spare, why not donate it to the Pop Up pantry in the church porch, where short life products are also available to prevent the food being wasted.

If you're only cooking a small amount of food, consider using a microwave oven or air fryer rather than an oven. Consider batch cooking meals, or simply cooking double the quantity you need, and freezing portions for use another time.
