Remembering Month

November is a time for looking back, a time for remembering. On All Saints Day, 1st November we remember the Christian saints and martyrs down the centuries who gave their lives for Christ and remember our own loved ones who have died.

The first Sunday in November is also the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church (IDOP), which reminds us that conflict is far from over: 380 million Christians worldwide live under the threat of persecution today. Remembrance Sunday itself is of course a time to remember with gratitude the supreme sacrifices that our armed forces made during World War I, World War II and other more recent conflicts.

Sunday in the church calendar: the Sunday of Christ the King, when we celebrate Jesus as the risen, ascended, alorified King of Kings and Lord of Lords. seated at the Father's side, and look forward to his coming again in glory. Revelation 21 promises that one day God will wipe every tear from our eyes, and death will be no more; grief, crying, and pain will be no more, because the previous things will have passed away. So, this month is not only a time for Remembrance, but a time for looking forward to the world to come, when 'Thy Kingdom Come' will no longer be a prayer of hope, but an eternal glorious reality for all who trust in Christ.

St Mary's Building UpdateChurch Heating

Since the colder weather has come, the church boiler has been working, but at times has been rather temperamental. The 3D survey of the church, commissioned in July, has now been completed by the church architects, Archangel. The next step will be to appoint a Mechanical and Electrical Engineer to draft a design for a new heating system. The PCC has received three quotes, and a small team has been appointed to move things forward.

A proposal to improve accessibility

The PCC has been considering a short term proposal to remove two short pews in the nave, and create a ramp and platform in the aisle level with the pew platform, to create two areas where wheelchair users could be accommodated. There are currently three regular wheelchair users attending St Mary's, and seating options are very limited. The hope would be that this could be done under temporary reordering permission, which lasts two years, and has to be fully reversible at the end of that time, or taken forward to the full faculty process. More information will be made available soon.



Safeguarding Sunday is coming up but as soon as we hear the word Safeguarding, we want the floor to open up and to disappear down the hole! Because with it usually comes a request to compete a safeguarding module or to have a DBS check, and all the while, you may be thinking what has that got to do with me? Well, rather a lot actually!

Protecting vulnerable people from harm and speaking up for their rights is an integral part of our scriptural mandate as Christians. "Speak out on behalf of the voiceless, and for the rights of all who are vulnerable." (Proverbs 31:8).

The exploitation of children and the vulnerable fills our news feeds and we can all feel disgust at the actions of a few. And it is a few, fortunately, but they may be all around us. How would we know? As a Church we are not exempt from the abuse of power and the Makin Report, which was recently published, is a stark reminder that we are all accountable for our actions and inactions.

It is these inactions which we must own, for unless we know what abuse can look like, we cannot speak out on behalf of the voiceless, and for the rights of all who are vulnerable. I am reminded of an incident that happened over 20 years ago now, when my neighbour, who was the head of a small school, let the abuse of a child go unchallenged. This was all over the news at the time and the head had to resign.

Abuse doesn't always happen by people of power. Sometimes, and more often than not, it occurs in the child's own home. The place where they should feel most safe.

The Safeguarding training modules help us to identify when we should speak out. They give guidance on who to contact and the steps that need to be taken. They identify the different types of abuse and you would be shocked to know that any one of us can be affected by these at some point in our lives. Wouldn't you like to know that someone in your circle notices when something is wrong?

As Parish Safeguarding Officer, it is my vision that the whole congregation, not just those in voluntary roles, did at least complete the basic safeguarding module so that we all can play a part in keeping everyone safe, not just in our Church but Jo Proctor beyond too.

PRAYER FOR SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY Dear God.

Help us to be a church that: Loves, welcomes, protects. Listens, learns, serves. Repents, restores, transforms. Values, cares, believes. God of Justice and compassion, hear our prayer. Help us, heal us, guide us, we pray.

In Jesus name. Amen.

Environment Matters

As the days get shorter and the temperature drops, there's a great temptation to turn the heating on full and only go out in the car! Here are some alternative ideas for coping with the winter weather, most of which were first published by Kathy in Nov 2023.

Keep warm by going for a walk and enjoy the changing colours and seedheads in gardens and in the countryside and be enlivened by the fresh air and daylight. And then, as the evening draws in, remember to close your curtains at dusk to keep the heat in.

Take pleasure in feeling cosy, by wearing warm clothes, and using wraps and throws to keep you warm, together with hot water bottles and heated pads.

If you have a chimney, but don't use an open fire, you can draught proof your chimney with a commercially available bag, or make your own with a pillow case filled with scrunched up newspaper. Hang something from the bag/case so that you remember to remove it before lighting a fire. Cut out drafts under doors by making a 'sausage' draft excluder.

To raise your spirits, look out for good news stories about how people are trying to make a difference and taking care of God's creation. Be glad that what you do does make a difference, and share what you are doing with others to encourage each other. You can do that by sending me your favourite tips—maybe a tasty recipe for leftovers, or something you have repaired or re-purposed, or something you have done in the garden to encourage wildlife.
